



ITALY

1. Legal powers - contained in law no. 833/88

These functions are delegated to the regions

police and other public aid is provided to the competent regional and/or local authorities according to the national laws on this subject.

2. Finance

The funds for the public veterinary sector are set aside from the national health fund. In case of need these funds can be supplemented.

These funds cover:

- Personnel
- Emergency vaccination and vaccine
- Destruction and disinfection

Compensation is governed by law 218 (1988) and 289 (1989). The cost of compensation shall be borne by the tied funds of the national health fund. The finance minister shall assign directly to the regions the funds for payout of slaughter compensation. The regions shall arrange payment within 60 days after slaughtering.

3. Chain of command:

Director General Veterinary Service
(Chairman of Standing Emergency Committee C.P.E.)

National Action Group (GDN)

Regional Committee for the Prevention of Animal Diseases (C.R.Z.)

Local Action Centres

The Standing Emergency Committee (C.P.E.) meets at regular intervals and contains representatives from:

- Headquarter divisions
- National Reference Laboratories
- Regional Veterinary Services
- Other Government Departments

The CPE is aided by the National Centre for epidemiology, veterinary planning and information (TERAMO).

In times of emergency the CPE sets up the national action group (Gruppo Operativo Nazionale)

This national body confirms protection and surveillance zones determined by the C.O.T. (see later)

4. REGIONAL ORGANISATIONS

Each region (19) has a Regional Committee for the prevention of animal diseases (CRZ - Comitato Regionale Per La Zooprofilassi) headed by the Regional Veterinarian.

This body includes laboratory experts and epidemiologists.

In times of emergency the CRZ sets up a Regional Action Group (GDR) and calls together the Regional Epidemiological Group (GER) which comprises one epidemiologist, one meteorologist and one veterinarian from the regional service.

Local organisations

Each local action centre (COT) is headed by a veterinarian either from the regional service or from the local USL. The implementation of measures in infected holdings is entrusted to a veterinary intervention group (G.I.V.),

5. Expert groups

The Brescia laboratory coordinates epidemiological enquiries for the vesicular diseases together with the epidemiological centre at Teramo (see also above for other epidemiological groups).

6. PERSONNEL

- 12 FMD experts at the regional laboratories
- 2 veterinarians at each USL (supplemented by other USL staff if necessary)

The sanitary law foresees the need to transfer staff into an epidemic zone but this will be avoided if possible as drafted staff do not know the territory.

7. EQUIPMENT - available to USL (Regional and national authorities keep a check on this provision)

8. STANDING INSTRUCTIONS (Provided in an annex)

- As soon as this plan is approved by the Commission copies will be circulated to all USLS (via the regional offices)

9. DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY (see Annex 1)

- The laboratory for vesicular diseases is the Istituto Zooprofilattico Brescia.

10 VACCINATION - CRITERIA LAID DOWN IN ARTICLE 2 OF THE MINISTERIAL ORDER (No details given)

11 TRAINING

- Training programmes will be organised by Brescia in cooperation with veterinary HQ. and the regions


