*** The following conditions must be met for moving Sharwil avocados from Hawaii.

1. All harvesting and handling must be done under the control of a person or persons who have signed a Compliance Agreement (PPQ Form 519).

2. A Limited Permit (PPQ Form 530) is issued by PPQ in Hawaii for each shipment if the following conditions are met:

a. Conditions to be met during the harvesting of Sharwil avocado--the avocados must:

- 1) Have stems attached which is evidence that the fruit was picked from the tree rather than picked up off the ground.
- 2) Be determined by an inspector to be the Sharwil variety.
- 3) Be picked at premises that grow only the Sharwil variety of avocado.
- 4) Be placed immediately in containers containing only Sharwil avocados having their stems attached. The avocados must remain in such containers until taken to the packing facility.
- 5) Be moved to a packing facility within 12 hours after being picked.

b. Conditions to be met at the packing facility--the packing facility must:

- 1) Maintain the facility free of all tri-fly (Mediterranean fruit fly, melon fly, and Oriental fruit fly) host material (other than Sharwil avocados that meet the harvesting conditions listed on the previous page).
- 2) Maintain the facility free of tri-fly.
